#### **Venue information**

Our 2021 conference takes place at Cardiff City Hall, King Edward VII Ave, Cardiff CF10 3ND Cardiff, Wales.

Cardiff, the capital of Wales, is a compact, friendly city with national museums, a spectacular castle, and a 76,000 seater stadium right at its heart. City Hall is a civic building in Cathays Park, Cardiff. It serves as Cardiff's centre of local government. It was built as part of the Cathays Park civic centre development and opened on October 1906. Built of Portland stone, it is an important early example of the Edwardian Baroque style.

#### Getting to Cardiff City Hall

By train Cardiff Central is the main train station in the city and has direct links to many cities in the UK including London, Birmingham, Manchester, Nottingham, Bristol and Southampton. The journey time from London Paddington to Cardiff is just over 2 hours. Trains leave every 30 minutes.

Cardiff Central is a short taxi ride to Cardiff City Hall or approximately a 16 minute walk.

By car Car parking on site at City Hall is limited. Visitors are advised to use the paid on street parking spaces around City Hall. Car parking is also available at Castle Mews and North Road.

Airports Cardiff Airport is based in the Rhoose area of the Vale of Glamorgan. The most direct route from the airport to Cardiff city centre is the T9 shuttle bus, which takes about 40 minutes to get to Cardiff city centre. The nearest train station to the airport is Rhoose. It takes 30 minutes to reach Cardiff Central.
